Visa

Poland is in the Schengen area and when you get a visa to Poland you can travel to all European countries. There are different types of visas depending on certain situations. You should choose the one that suits you best, <u>but we recommend you to apply for Visa type C.</u>

- 1. A type: Type A Visa valid only for airport transit; does not entitle the holder to leave the airport,
- 2. C type: Type C Visa is valid in the Schengen Area and permits its holder to remain in the territory of all of the Schengen Area Member Countries for a maximum of 90 days during a 180-day period. Schengen Visa with limited territorial validity is valid in the territory of one or more Schengen Area Member States, but not in all the Schengen Area Member States and permits its holder to remain in their territories for a maximum of 90 days during a 180-day period.

3. **D type**: Type D Visa is a national visa that permits to enter the territory of Poland and to stay continuously or for several successive times in this territory for a total duration of more than 90 days during the period of validity of the visa, but not longer than one year.
